- 6. Find the official state flower, the beautiful Kansas Sunflower anywhere in Northeast Kansas!
- 7. LENEXA Lake Lenexa's dam and spillway merge engineering with art using innovative and cutting-edge concrete and earthwork practices. The artistic designed water cycle features fountains, sculptures and cascading pools. 9053 Monticello Rd.
- 8. MIAMI COUNTY Let a few arrows fly at the Sunflower Archery Range at Hillsdale Lake. The range is open daily and Wisitors will need to bring their own bow. 26000 W. 255th St.
- 9. SENECA Spring Creek Golf Course allows you to enjoy all the amenities of a professional grade course on a Par 71, 18-hole, public golf course. - 11. LECOMPTON served as the territorial capital from 1854-1861. Come explore historical museums that provide a glimpse into the past. 640 E. Woodson Ave.

- 14. DONIPHAN COUNTY "Tall Oak" Indian monument sits in the courtyard of the Doniphan County Courthouse in Troy. This Kansas Monument was sculpted by Peter Toth from a Burr Oak log and stands nearly 5 feet in diameter and 27 feet tall..
- 15. LEAVENWORTH Waysides are interactive displays located throughout Leavenworth that include an audio tour guide for each specific location. Explore the history of where the west began.

- 21. BONNER SPRINGS Throw a disc around the 18-hole Cedar Ridge Disc Golf Course located at North Park, 1200 S. 134th St.
- 22. LOUISBURG No day trip is complete without shopping. Louisburg, home to specialty stores loaded with antiques, accessories, clothing and other curios, does not disappoint. Inside Simply Se-Lah, a downtown boutique, you'll find an array of new and vintage pieces alongside craft work from local artisans. With more than 26,000 sq ft of antique furniture and architectural salvage to browse through at Louisburg Market Street, a rare find is bound to catch your eye. The hunt is half the fun at Captain Cook's Treasure Chest where you can explore up to 50 vendor booths offering antique and vintage items, assorted local art and handcrafted goods.
